International Commission on Intervention and State Sovereignty

The International Commission on Intervention and State Sovereignty (ICISS) was an ad hoc commission of participants which in 2001 worked to popularize the concept of humanitarian intervention under the name of "Responsibility to protect". The Commission was instigated by Lloyd Axworthy and the Government of Canada in September 2000 and co-chaired by Gareth Evans and Mohamed Sahnoun under the authority of the Canadian Government and consisted of members from the UN General Assembly.

The Commission argues that sovereignty implies responsibility, and that where a state fails to carry out its fundamental responsibilities to its citizens, then a residual responsibility falls on the international community. Military intervention is not ruled out, but it is only countenanced as a last resort in times of crisis when a substantial loss of life or widespread ethnic cleansing has
